

RED FOX

Vulpes fulva



Red Foxes probably mate for life. The den is usually in the open, on a Sunny hillside. It may be in a rock cavity, in a hollow log, or frequently in an abandoned woodchuck den. The bed for the young is lined with grasses.

Mating occurs from January to March when the Red Fox's high pitched barking enlivens the Wintery night. After a gestation period of 48 to 56 days, the young are born, usually four to Six per litter. Pups stay in the den until they are weaned at about eight to ten weeks. By fall they are full grown and usually go their own way.

The Red Fox is 25 to 29 inches long, with a fourteen to Sixteen inch tail. Weight averages about 10-15 pounds.
