

# 2022 Annual Report Looking Back, Moving Forward

## Just a Note...

Dear Friends of River Bend Nature Center,

We are pleased to provide you with an update on our work in the following pages of our 2022 annual report.

**Looking back** at the last year, it's been an important time for River Bend. Together we've navigated significant transitions and some setbacks including emerging from the pandemic with even more demand for helping people stay connected with nature, saw a significant reduction in our endowment funds caused by the stock market downturn, facilitated a successful move away from charitable gambling revenue and operations as a core part of RBNC's model, and led a successful executive director search when Breanna Wheeler decided to leave her role as executive director of River Bend.

Even just one of these major transitions or setbackswould have been enough for a smaller non-profit like River Bend to falter but through all of that, work- staff, board members, and volunteers continuously focused on **moving us forward** and made 2022 a banner year for River Bend Nature Center. While navigating these transitions we successfully welcomed Brad Bourn as our new executive director, met increased demand for programming and trail use, laid the foundations of improving our partnerships with the City of Faribault and the DNR, secured near record levels of contributions and grants to all but eliminate our need to draw from our endowments in 2022 while still doing our work and making investments in our aging infrastructure. We're also proud to have begun our work on a long-term strategic planning process to guide River Bend's work for the next generation.

In the following pages, you'll read in more detail about our work as one of the most important environmental stewards in Southern Minnesota. We're so proud to have made positive impacts in the lives of thousands of people in and around Faribault hailing from all walks of life and all corners of the globe as we protected our natural resources and helped people discover, enjoy, understand, and preserve the incredible natural world that surrounds us all.


